What We Expect from Our Volunteers

Volunteer Awareness & Training Opportunities

An initial introduction to volunteer opportunities is presented two times a year to the Bible Teachings class. Other volunteer opportunities can be found in the bimonthly Trinity Newsletter or by contacting individual ministry directors. In addition, volunteer opportunities are listed in the weekly church bulletin or Victoria West, Director of Connections, can provide information as well. Ministry leaders will organize on-going training for volunteer positions that pertain to their particular ministry.



Church or School Access

In order to protect our children during the school day, anyone entering the building must state their purpose in order to be buzzed in. After entering the building, the first order of business is to check in/sign in with either the church or school administrative assistant. They will assist you from there. If you are meeting after church office or school hours, the ministry leader or security will be responsible for letting you into the building. Security is on the premises 6pm to approximately 10pm Monday-Friday; 5pm-7:30 pm on Saturdays, and 7:30am-1:00 pm on Sundays.

Protection Ministry Program

Serving children and youth is a core ministry at Trinity, and we are committed to their safety. To assist in providing a safe environment, the following protection policy has been put in place:

- ·Those who work with children, youth, or vulnerable adults must be screened
- ·A confidential application must be filled out
- ·A criminal background check will be done

Emergency Procedures

Trinity Lutheran Church and School strives to ensure a safe and secure environment for everyone. Similar to paid staff, volunteers are entrusted with promoting the safety of those whom they serve.

·Fire Emergencies- a system of smoke detectors and alarms have been installed and are maintained throughout the building. This system is directly wired to the Tinley Park Fire Department. If the alarm sounds, please evacuate the building in an expedited manner, based on the evacuation plans posted throughout the building and in each classroom. When exiting the building move as far away from the building as possible. The soccer field would suffice until further direction is given by administrative /security staff or first responders.

Weather Emergencies-in the event of a tornado or flooding the weather center outside the school office will have mention of alerts. Please make sure that everyone is inside the building and if you are in a classroom and have the opportunity to close windows and blinds, that would be advised. Please avoid the hallways with large areas of glass windows. Weather emergencies will typically be monitored by security personnel to gain additional information. Consult the emergency plan located in each classroom, Trinity Room and throughout the church for more specific information.



·First Aid Kits- can be found in the school office, in the Children's Ministry office, in the church office, in the elder's closet and at the welcome center.

·AEDs-are located in the hallway outside of the school gymnasium, in the new addition hallway and the wall outside of the Trinity Room as you exit toward Door #7.

·911- should be called whenever there is a question related to a potential concern with a medical or security question.

·Alert Security- alert security and/or leadership staff, if possible, to situations in which you sense an unusual situation with individuals, conditions and/or materials. Security will look into the situation themselves and contact local authorities if necessary.

·Building Maintenance Issues- again contact security personnel in the event of an unusual building maintenance issues regarding water, power failure, unusual smells within the building.

Volunteer Recognition

When a volunteer gives their time, talent, and/or resources it helps to strengthen our church and school. At Trinity, we believe volunteers play a key role in addressing the growth of our church and school and also play a part in transforming the lives of others. That is why we welcome volunteers to share their positive experiences concerning their passion for a particular ministry. Ministry leaders and the Director of Connections work together to develop intentional ways to share their thanks for volunteer efforts.



TRINITY MINISTRIES

Some examples of ministries/volunteer opportunities throughout Trinity would be:

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FRIENDSHIP SUNDAY

What is Friendship Sunday?

Friendship Sunday usually occurs at the end of August and is an opportunity for people to invite friends and family members to church and then enjoy a cookout and games afterward.

Friendship Sunday takes place in the soccer field. There are usually at least 350-425 people in attendance. We serve hot dogs, hamburgers, chicken, potato salad, chips, and dessert.

The entertainment format of Friendship Sunday changes from year to year. Some years we have carnival type rides, climbing walls, and a mechanical bull. Other years we have basketball, volleyball, pickle ball, bocce ball, bags, bubbles, painting, and water balloons. Still, in other years we have carnival games and prizes for the kids.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES:

Set Up:

Set up tables, chairs, garbage cans, games, coolers, condiments, etc.

Work Event:

Replenish food, condiments, drinks, empty garbage cans, wipe off tables, etc.

Oversee Painting Table:

There will be a table full of paint, paintbrushes, and canvases for kids to create their masterpiece.

Oversee Bubble Making Table:

There will be a table full of bubbles and bubble wands for kids to play with.

Grill Master: We will have 2 grills going at a time.

Carnival Games:

Oversee carnival game participation and pass out prizes.

Clean-Up:

Put away tablecloths, empty coolers, put garbage in dumpster, tables away in the gym.

SUNDAY SCHOOL/REVEAL KIDS/VBS

Preschool Sunday School (PK3 & PK4) uses a curriculum called Frolic. Frolic is a play-based curriculum that helps young children experience Bible stories in a meaningful and memorable way. Repetition is an important part of learning during early childhood and that is why each story has two weeks of lessons so children can revisit each story and go deeper. (9:30am-10:30am in the gym).



Sunday School (Kindergarten-5th grade) uses a curriculum called Holy Moly. This is a curriculum

that uses creative and visual storytelling to enhance the learning experience. Children participate in the story and are engaged in answering questions about the story and how the story may apply to their lives. Each week has a little different activity to keep things interesting. Some weeks children do crafts, some weeks they sing songs that relate back to the story, and some weeks they engage in Bible trivia related to the weekly story. (9:30-10:30am in north hallway of school).

Reveal Kids (4yr to 3rd grade) uses the same curriculum that the Sunday school kids follow, just a little condensed as Reveal Kids only meets for about 30 minutes each week in the music room during the sermon at the 11am service. The Pastor releases the kids prior to the beginning of his sermon. **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES:**

Teachers (Adult) and Teacher Aides (Adult, High school, Jr. High age)

Here is what you **DON'T** need in order to be a Sunday School teacher or Reveal Kids Teacher:

- ·You don't need to know the Bible inside and out
- ·You don't need teaching experience
- ·You **don't** need to teach every week
- ·You don't need to spend hours every week trying to prepare for a lesson
- ·You don't need to come up with a craft or materials for a craft every week

Here is what you **DO** need in order to be a Sunday School or Reveal Kids Teacher:

- ·You **do** need to want to enhance the spiritual life of our Trinity children
- ·You do need to want to spend about 15 minutes a week to look over the lesson provided to you
- ·You **do** need to have a heart for children
- ·You **do** need to be prepared for the rewarding feeling you will get when these kids are learning about Jesus
- ·You ${f do}$ need to be prepared for the bond you and the children will experience throughout the year sharing stories about Jesus
- ·You do need to have fun

LIVE NATIVITY

What is a Live Nativity?

It is a traditional nativity scene brough to life with church members both adults and children dressed in period costumes. This unique setting takes place in our sanctuary with a stable, manger, bales of straw, and some simulated animals and plants.

This distinctive event brings our Christmas celebration to another level. In addition to the Live Nativity, we have The Bethlehem Marketplace which includes shopkeepers selling trinkets or handing out delicious free snacks. We have our choir singing between performances as members and visitors alike join them in singing their favorite Christmas carols.

If that isn't enough, people can head into the Trinity Room to have a cup of hot chocolate with a cookie and fellowship with each other. The energy surrounding this event is like no other.

A Live Nativity event also offers Trinity the opportunity to introduce itself to the community. It is a time to connect

with people in our surrounding area. It promotes intergenerational relationships as people of all ages volunteer to help and spend time together.

Our Live Nativity can have a significant impact on members and visitors and on believers and non-believers alike. People are literally able to reach out and touch the message of Christmas and all that it means. In 2024, Trinity hosted our 8th Live Nativity over the last 10 years.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Actors- (both adults and children): Mary, Joseph, King Herod, Gabriel, Innkeeper, 3 Wisemen (all adults), Shepherds (adults & children), Angels (adults & children). There are no speaking parts. The entire live nativity is narrated by Pastor Strand.

"Jewelry" Shopkeeper– sit in tent and pass out candy necklaces, bracelets, or candy ring pops to the kids.

"Tax Collector" Tent- sit in tent and pass out chocolate "gold" coins to the kids.

"Olive Oil & Bread" Shopkeeper- sit in tent and fill little cups with olive oil, premade spices, and add a piece of bread.

"Grains" Shopkeeper- sit in tent and dip a large marshmallow that is on a skewer in some melted chocolate and roll in crushed graham cracker to make a s'more to pass out to kids and adults alike.

Trinity Room Coffee, Hot Chocolate, and Cookies- assist with making and passing out hot chocolate, coffee, and cookies too. Clean-up at end.

Costume Distribution- pass out costumes to actors and retrieve, organize, and hang up costumes when the actor's role is completed.

YOUTH GROUP

What is Youth Group?

Youth Group is not just another extra-curricular activity; it is an essential part of the identity of a Christ-follower. Youth can gather in a safe, Christian environment and express themselves through several different activities and Bible studies.

Currently, the youth group is made up of students primarily in 6th-8th grade although there are a few who are in 9th-11th grade who attend when sports or high school events let them. Junior and Senior High youth events begin at 6pm and end between 7pm and 8pm depending on the activity. We have also added the 4th and 5th grade students into the mix one time per month after school from 2:45pm-4pm.



Our youth are learning important life skills such as cooking and baking; painting; how to use tools and stain wood; how to take care of your skin; and how to give back through service projects. We have a service project at All God's People to help sort clothes for the homeless scheduled just about every month. There is also Bible study one time a month. We are currently studying character influencers of the Bible. [Paul's Integrity, Johathan's Loyalty, Josiah's Determination, Mary's Obedience, and Daniel's Consistency].

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

There are weekly volunteer opportunities with the youth group. We do not need someone to lead the activity, but rather to help with the activity. Youth group offers a variety of activities which change month to month and year to year. You do not have to be an expert in any area to lend a helping hand.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

General Bible Study – Start your own small group at church or in your home. Your group can be age specific or open to everyone. Choose the time, location, and topic for your group.

Men's Group – Trinity has a men's group that meets on Saturday morning for breakfast at 7:00am and a Bible study at 8:00am. You can expand this ministry by helping with the Saturday morning group, or by leading a men's group on another day of the week.

Women's Group - Trinity has a women's group that meets on Sunday morning at 9:30am. You can expand this ministry by helping with the Sunday morning group, or by leading a women's group on another day of the week.

Couples, Marriage, or Parents Group - Trinity has a couple's group that meets on Sunday morning. You can expand this ministry by helping with the Sunday morning group, or by leading your own group on another day of the week.

Grief Share – Trinity offers support groups for those that have lost a loved one. Current Grief Share groups meet at Trinity on Tuesday at 1:00pm or 7:00pm. There is an online group that meets on Wednesday at 7:30pm. You can assist any of these groups, or lead your own grief support group.

Dementia Support Group – Lead a group to support those caring loved ones with dementia. Choose the time and location of your group.

Weight Loss Support Group - Lead a group to support those working to lose weight. Choose the time and location of your group.

PRAYER MINISTRIES

What Is the Prayer Chain?

The Prayer Chain is a group of Trinity Members that regularly pray for the needs of the congregation and for their family and friends. Members of the prayer chain pray on their own schedule as often as they choose. All prayer requests remain confidential.



What Is Prayer INC?

Prayer INC is a ministry and stands for Interceding for the Needs of the Congregation. Members of Prayer INC receive a list of Trinity members to call. They call the member on their own schedule and pray for them over the phone.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Prayer Chain – Join the Prayer Chain. You will receive a list of Trinity Members that have made prayer requests. You will pray for them privately, on your own schedule, without the need to contact the person.

Prayer INC – Join Prayer INC. You will receive a list of Trinity members to call. Call members on your own schedule and pray for them over the phone.

LUNCH BUNCH



What is Lunch Bunch?

Trinity hosts a Senior Bible study every Tuesday morning at 11:00am. The Bible study is followed by a luncheon at 12:00pm.

Food Preparation – Help with the cooking and preparing of food.

Setup & Cleanup – Help setup the luncheon or cleanup afterwards.

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MEN OF TRINITY HELPING HANDS

What is Men of Trinity Helping Hands?

The Men's group is a group of men from Trinity, offering their time and talents to members within the community. They are blessed to give gifts of general work needed around their homes. They specialize in helping widows, widowers, single moms, senior citizens, and anyone needing of help.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Join Men's Group - The Men's group does service projects every Saturday morning from 10:00am – 12:00pm. They do not work more than two hours. They usually do general yard cleanup (i.e. leaf removal, bush trimming, etc.) No experience is needed. Tools will be provided. You are not obligated to attend every Saturday.

SOUL WINNING

Sharing our faith is something that many Christians struggle with doing. "Soul Winning" is a group of Trinity members that witnesses door-to-door. They go two-by-two and knock on doors in the community. They follow a process of three steps in their conversations:



- 1. Start the conversation by asking specific questions.
- 2. Present the Gospel.
- 3. Finish and lead in prayer.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Silent Partner – The group has extended an invitation to anyone in the congregation willing to go as the "silent partner." You are not expected to say anything. You merely observe and act as moral support.

Speaking Role – After participating as a "silent partner," you may have the desire to do the speaking part. No experience is necessary. Training is available and will take as little as two sessions. You will not have to speak until you feel comfortable enough to do so.

Witnessing to Friends and Family – If you are not comfortable knocking on doors, but still want to witness in your personal life, you can learn how to use this process with your friends and family. Schedule a training session that will teach you this strategy in two sessions.

REVEAL WORSHIP

What is Reveal Worship?

REVEAL WORSHIP is our contemporary worship service here at Trinity Lutheran Church & School. The idea of this service began in the hearts of Trinity members in 2006. We held our first "REVEAL" service on April 13, 2008. Originally an additional weekend service on Sunday evenings, this service has grown, and is now held at 11:00am on Sundays.



REVEAL is modern in style and sound, utilizing a full band and a team of vocalists. Our aim is to worship God and give glory to Jesus, connecting with individuals of different backgrounds, culture, and experience but holding tightly to God's Word, Promises, and Presence throughout our lives. We incorporate Scripture, Creeds, and Sacraments within each worship gathering, carrying our Lutheran heritage along with our contemporary worldview.

There are many opportunities to serve! Production of the many elements in each REVEAL service is made possible by the dedication of a team of volunteers. Our REVEAL Band and Vocal team, along with our Audio, Visual, and Stream teams are always seeking additional members. You don't have to have high level of experience, but a willingness to learn and to serve.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

In general, we are seeking High School and Adult aged volunteers. Experience is appreciated but we desire to incorporate a variety of proficiency levels. Come as you are!

REVEAL Band – Drums, Bass, Keyboard (Piano, Organ, Synth), Acoustic Guitar, Electric Guitar (Rhythm, Lead), Violin, Mandolin, Horns, etc.

REVEAL Vocal Team – Lead and Background Singers (Male and Female singers)

Audio Team - Sound Engineers for In-Person Worship and Online-Stream

Visual Team - Screen Operator and Lighting Control

Second Sunday Fellowship Dinners are periodic meals throughout the year designed to facilitate relationships and connection as an extension of our worship. We need helpers to lead the meal along with a small team of support volunteers to set up and clean up after each gathering. (Meal costs are covered by Trinity and donations.)

MUSIC MINISTRY

What is the Music Ministry?

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Chancel Choir – We rehearse I hour a week on Monday nights at 6 PM. You do not have to be experienced or know how to read music to join.
